

# "CHANGE DOES NOT CHANGE TRADITION, IT STRENGTHENS IT." - PRINCE PHILIP

Last week began on a high note with the release of the 2017 ERO "Education Review Office" Review report. We are really delighted ERO has recognised RGHS's exceptional performance with a 4-5 year review.

A key message from the report states and I quote 'the school is highly effective in its response to those learners whose progress and achievement need acceleration.'

The review also identified the reasons behind these findings - 'school conditions that are enabling the achievement of equity and excellence include a well designed and responsive curriculum, highly effective leadership, effective teaching and learning support, meaningful partnerships with parents and whānau and strong governance.

And further added 'school performance has been sustained over time through well-focused, embedded processes and practices. This school has successfully addressed in-school disparities in achievement. Learners are achieving excellent educational outcomes.'

It is hard to believe that we are already halfway through term 4. We have celebrated our ASCA Awards, our Annual Senior Prizegiving and farewelled our Leavers. We are very proud of all the girls, their achievements and the way they completed their year. Senior students started their NCEA external examinations this week. This is a key part of their learning journey towards tertiary education and / or their chosen vocational pathway.

The focus for junior students continues to be on developing the key competencies or capabilities that will enable them to live, learn, work, and contribute as active members of our community, to strive to reach their potential as leaders in the global environment.

The New Zealand Curriculum provides a common framework and direction for schools, giving each school the scope, flexibility, and authority to design and shape their curriculum so that teaching and learning is meaningful and beneficial to their particular community of students.

Over the last three years here at Rotorua Girls High School our focus has been on the review of the school curriculum and the implementation of pedagogy which is Culturally Responsive, Relational and Future Focussed. Curriculum design and review is a continuous, cyclic process, building on our existing good practice. This process involves making decisions about how to give effect to the New Zealand Curriculum in ways that best meets the needs, interests, and talents of our girls.

Some of the changes introduced over the years include: a decision to move to a six day timetable inorder to provide the opportunity for all learning areas equal time to further develop learners' key competencies, and to understand and explore links with other curriculum learning areas. The introduction of BYOD- 'Bring Your Own Device' programme for all Year Nine and Year Ten students as we believed that this initiative provided a rich, well rounded programme which would support students in their learning towards the senior school and on line reporting. Next year all Year 9 and 10 students will be involved in Project Based/ Future Focussed learning programmes.

The Senior Leadership Team, Heads of Faculty and staff are constantly considering how to meet the ever-changing needs of the students and this is evident in the rich number of courses, subjects, and pathways that are open to RGHS students.



Special thanks to our guest speaker at our Senior Academic Prizegiving, former RGHS student Sandra Venables. Sandra is the first female Assistant Commissioner Road Policing.

Students I spoke to were highly enthusiastic about Sandra's presentation and motivated by her success, particularly in light of her personal story of humble origins. She shared that, despite this, she was driven and determined to achieve her goals. She encouraged the girls to make the

most of opportunities when they arose and to surround themselves with people who support them.

Special thanks to Councillor Tania Tapsell, Monty Morrison, Chair of Ngati Whakaue Education Sub-Committee, Jackie Woodland, Ngati Whakaue Endowment Trust Education Advisor for supporting and attending our prizegiving. Thank you to Tui McCaull, Whaea Aramoana and all staff who organized this event and worked so hard to make it a wonderful success.

On the subject of achievement, I wanted to celebrate academic success. Firstly, congratulations to all those students who have been recognised at our end-of-year prize givings — it is great to celebrate the success that all of your hard work has earned.

Secondly I would also like to acknowledge the personal successes that I hope all of our students can feel they have achieved this year. Often the attainment of success is gradual and progressive so it is worth reflecting on the learning challenges that students have overcome and how much each individual has learnt and grown throughout the year. I think it is also worth taking time to acknowledge the opportunities that Rotorua Girls' High School offers its students who all have different interests and aspirations. The Senior Graduation Dinner will be held on Wednesday 6 December at 6pm. This occasion will mark a significant milestone for many of our students and their parents. It is an appropriate way to acknowledge our Year 13 students. They have been an outstanding group of students who have set their own tradition of excellence and as such are a credit to this school, to their parents and to themselves.

All the best to our Year 13 students and other school leavers. Our hope is that you have gained during your time at RGHS, the qualifications, capabilities, attributes and values which will stand you in good stead, whatever the future might hold. Thank you also to parents, particularly those who will no longer have daughters at Rotorua Girls High School. Your support and contribution over several years is invaluable and the experiences our young women have had as a result have been richer because of your input.

Many thanks to my Deputy Principals, Whaea Aramoana and Raewyn Krammer, Assistant Principal Tui McCaull and all the teaching staff for their commitment to providing the best education possible and to Barbara Leckey our Executive Officer and the support staff for the efforts they put in behind-the-scenes to enable the school to function effectively.

in closing I would like to wish all of our students, families and staff all the very best for the upcoming holidays. I hope you are able to create some special family memories over the summer break and that our students come back relaxed and refreshed for 2018. 
