Te Ao Kori - traditional Maori games, maramataka Māori (the Māori lunar calendar), te reo me ōna tikanga (language and customs), and guiding principles such as kotahitanga/unity, kaitiakitanga/guardianship, manaakitanga/mana enhancing behaviour towards others, will be used to support your personal wellbeing journey.	
	Skills Developed	This is a practical course and will involve participation in a number of physical activities - fitness, games, sport and recreation. Ākonga will be expected to commit to a health and wellbeing cycle, so you must have good self-management with bringing PE gear as well as reflect on your progress. This course is open to all cultures and will give you a good grounding in Health and Physical Education concepts, as well as the matauranga Māori values and knowledge that will be inherent in the new NCEA standards in PE and Health.
